

Teacher Directions

Tell your students you are really excited about a story you wrote and that you want to share it with them. Your story should only be one sentence. After you read it to them, ask them what they think of the story. You can ask them if they think this is a good story? Why or why not? Students will begin to ask questions. Write a few of their questions on the whiteboard then have them come up with a few other questions. Students now turn these questions into statement and this will become their story.
