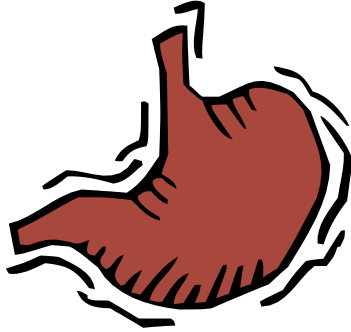


What Happens in Your Stomach

Your stomach can hold almost two quarts of food.

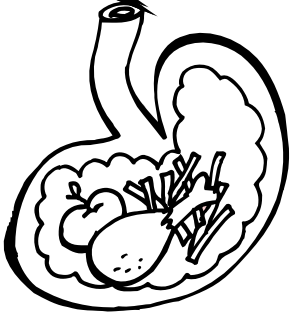
After you chew and swallow your food, your esophagus takes your food to your stomach.

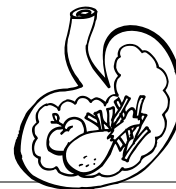
My stomach helps to break my food into smaller pieces.

My stomach can hold 1 quart of food.



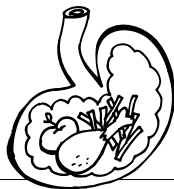
My stomach does not stretch.

My food reaches my stomach through a tube called my esophagus.

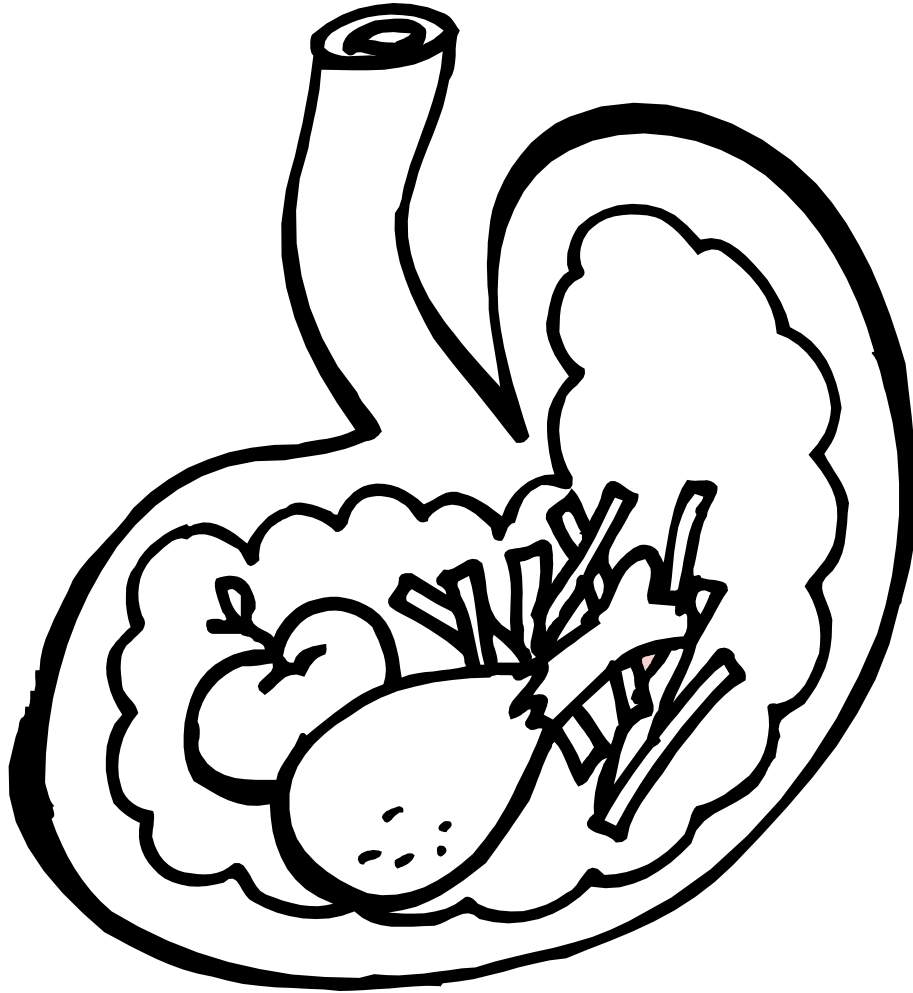


Special juices in my stomach help break my food down.
